Dear Nominating Committee,

It is with great pleasure that I submit this nomination of Bill Mitchell for induction into the Order of the Cascaron in 2020.

Bill comes from a Fiesta family and has logged a record of some 30 years of leadership-level Fiesta volunteer experience. I can't think of anyone who has consistently given more to Fiesta San Antonio than he.

Bill has been a member of The Order of the Alamo and the German Club since 1991 and a member of the Texas Cavaliers since 1997. His leadership roles in the Texas Cavaliers include number of River Parade Chairmanships (2000-2004), River Parade Operations Officer (2006), River Parade Vice Marshal and Board Member (2006), River Parade Marshal and Board Member (2007), Captain of the King's Guard and Board Member (2008), Activities Officer and Board Member (2009), Commander and Board Member (2010), King Antonio and Board Member (2011).

Importantly, during his five years as a Board Member of the Texas Cavaliers Charitable Foundation, the organization donated more than \$1 million to local children's charities.

From 1997 to 2016, Bill served on the Fiesta San Antonio Commission Finance, Personnel, Membership and Building Committees, and from 2012 to 2016, served as chair of Fit Fiesta, Membership, Audit, Fiesta Fiesta and Sponsorships committees, as well as led the Commission's transition from parade broadcasts on KLRN to a new era with KSAT-12 that ultimately included nationwide syndication of the Battle of Flowers and Fiesta Flambeau parades. Bill served as Fiesta Commission Secretary, Vice President and Senior Vice President before being elected President for 2018.

On Bill's first day as President, he announced that he was allergic to negativity, and that set the tone for a year of focusing on continuous improvement. Under his leadership, the Commission:

- Streamlined the PMO compliance process through face-to-face meetings;
- Took Miss Fiesta to the next level with an independent panel of judges and an elevated focus on community service;
- Sought to develop new, and grow existing, sources of revenue making more progress in moving expenses like parade broadcasts and magazine production to revenue generators – and more than doubling attendance and sponsor interest in Fiesta Fiesta;
- Raised the bar on ensuring a quality experience at FSAC member events;
- Grew its reach via social media exponentially; and
- Carefully cultivated select new Fiesta events among reputable nonprofits, including in locations outside the central city.

Bill Mitchell is so much more than the above list of Fiesta-related offices held. I have seen and experienced firsthand the respect, loyalty and dedication that Bill brings to the table in all his endeavors. His greatest achievement above everything listed above was a major change he made as Head of the Texas Cavalier River Parade in 2007. He saw an opportunity to move the cast-off point from the old Mariana/Weston Hotel area to behind the Tobin center. After concerns were voiced by many former parade marshals, he listened to reasons why it would not work and found solutions to make it work. That change was very successful and as a result over the past 12 years has allowed the river parade to prosper to new heights, not to mention, allowed the Cavaliers to be able to accommodate more seats on the River. Many of those seats and locations continue to be free areas. This is a prime example of someone who made an everlasting change to Fiesta. He's the one you listen to, the one you follow, the one who walks beside you and not in front of you. His influence and reputation crosses all segments of San Antonio, and the qualities he exhibits are qualities that would reflect very well on The Order of the Cascaron.

Thank you for considering this nomination. I very much look forward to Bill Mitchell's induction in March.
